Earth Day Stream Clean-up

The Lake Ontario Atlantic Salmon Restoration Program hosted our annual stream clean-up in Cobourg, north from Peace Park, as part of Earth Week activities. In partnership with the Community Stream Steward Program we had over 79 high school and Fleming College students contribute over 158 person-hours, cleaning more than 3,200m of Cobourg Brook in the heart of Cobourg, Ontario. The students pick up garbage along the stream bank with the help of adults (staff and volunteer) instream picking up trash and marking large items for safe removal. By cleaning up garbage in and along the stream we are improving the quality of migration routes for salmon and creating a healthier habitat for all stream inhabitants. Another benefit of this project is public awareness by giving the local students a sense of ownership for local watershed health.
