Albion Hills Conservation Area TD Tree Day Planting

The OFAH, Ontario Streams (one staff) and 27 TD Tree Day event volunteers (81 person-hours) returned to the Albion Hills Conservation Area to continue with the TD Tree Day reforestation plan started in 2013. Together we planted 201 large potted trees on a hillside of a drainage area that flows into the Humber River at the Albion Hills Conservation Area. On this project the Atlantic Salmon Program partnered with the TRCA, who mowed the field to make digging easier for volunteers. Large potted native tree species were planted to increase the chance of survival by out-growing the surrounding grasses in the 2,500m² planting area dominated by tall hard-stemmed grasses. The trees will improve Atlantic Salmon habitat by filtering harmful contaminants such as salt from the adjacent highway before they enter the creek.
